

Drywall Finisher Job Description

Job Duties and Responsibilities

- Apply joint compound to seams and corners of drywall to create a smooth surface
- Sand and smooth surfaces to blend in with surrounding areas
- Cut and hang drywall sheets to fit precise measurements
- Fill holes and cracks in drywall with joint compound and sand smooth
- Finish drywall by applying texture, paint, or wallpaper as requested
- Coordinate with other construction workers to ensure timely completion of projects
- Keep work area clean and organized to maintain safety on job site
- Communicate with supervisors and clients to ensure project specifications are met
- Use hand and power tools, including trowels, mud boxes, sanders, and saws

Experience and Education Requirements

- To work as a Drywall Finisher in the construction industry, you need to have a high school diploma or equivalent. It's also helpful to have some related experience or training in areas like painting, carpentry, or general construction. Many Drywall Finishers learn on the job, starting out as helpers and working their way up to become experts in the field. You will need to know how to prepare surfaces for finishing, apply joint compound, and use hand and power tools to sand, smooth, and texture the finish. Good hand-eye coordination, attention to detail, and physical stamina are critical. Being able to read and interpret blueprints and diagrams is a bonus.
- Strong working knowledge of job site safety as well as ability to complete a company specific safety orientation;

- Erecting scaffolding, ladders for assembling structures above ground levels;
- Assembling and fastening materials to make frameworks or props, using hand tools and wood screws, nails, dowel pins, or glue;
- Cut drywall to the right dimensions;
- Tape and finish drywall;
- Fluent using stilts and drywall hand tools;
- Mixing appropriate mud and textures;
- Applying appropriate mud;
